

DO YOU RECALL?

You know Dasher and Dancer and Prancer and Vixen, Comet and Cupid and Donder and Blitzen, but do you recall the most famous reindeer of all? Of course we do. Everyone knows the most famous reindeer of all. It has not always been the case though. The truth is that prior to 1939 no one had ever heard of the most famous reindeer of all because he didn't exist. Rudolph first appeared in a 1939 booklet put out by Montgomery Ward. But, here it is eighty-four years later, and Rudolph is still flying high. Who knows, maybe he will go down in history.

Fantasy, magical stories and fictional legends have become so much a part of Christmas in our culture that most of us can easily recall the names of all 9 reindeer. But do you recall, not the most famous, but the ONLY Savior of all? Of course we do. The beloved stories of flying reindeer and talking snowmen, stories of heartless Grinches, and Red Rider B.B. Guns, need not be cast aside. They make us smile and bring a certain warmth and nostalgia to the season. But they must never take the place of the Savior whose birth we celebrate.

Do you recall the only Savior of all? The One who came to us in the flesh, from the Father full of grace and truth (John 1:14). Far too many who are called to Him, who received Him as their Savior from sin, who confess Jesus to be the only Savior, far too many recall Him so infrequently that He has little influence in their daily lives. Jesus came to be Savior of the world not just for a day or two during the year. Jesus is our daily, hourly, yearly Savior who is with us always. To all who bear the name of Jesus, who claim Him to be the Savior, His call to us never changes. *Come and worship, come and worship, worship Christ the newborn king. The Measure of Our Generosity

If you open up the Small Catechism, you'll find a shortened version of the Third Commandment: "Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy." But if you look up the list of the Ten Commandments in Exodus, you'll find the full version:

Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days you shall labor, and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the LORD your God. On it you shall not do any work, you, or your son, or your daughter, your male servant, or your female servant, or your livestock, or the sojourner who is within your gates. For in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested on the seventh day. Therefore the LORD blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy. (Ex. 20:8–11)

Why did Luther shorten this commandment for the Small Catechism? Was it so that the kids wouldn't have so much to memorize? No, it was because Luther knew that all the details of the Third Commandment were part of the "shadow" of the Old Testament (Col. 2:16). Or as St. Paul puts it, there is "letter" in the Old Testament law and "spirit" (2 Cor. 3:6). The details of not working on Saturday were fulfilled by Christ. That part of the Sabbath regulation no longer applies. But the spirit of the law does remain: We need to dedicate sufficient time each week to hearing God's Word and giving it honor and respect. Or as Luther sums it up in the Small Catechism's explanation to the Third Commandment: "We should fear and love God so that we do not despise preaching and His Word but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it."

The same sort of analysis applies to our giving. In the Old Testament, God commanded the Israelites to give a tenth of their income to the Levites so that those men could dedicate their lives to serving in God's house, teaching the people, conducting worship, etc. In the New Testament, there is a rigid requirement listed about handing in your tax forms to church to make sure you've given enough. But the mandate to have a full-time ministry, which is the spirit of that law concerning tithing to the Levites, is right there in 1 Corinthians 9:14: "The Lord has ordained that those who preach the Gospel should make their living from the Gospel."

The New Testament church's job is significantly larger than the job of Old Testament Israel. We are commanded to preach the Gospel to all nations. There was only the temple to maintain in the Old Testament, but we have churches, schools, universities and seminaries, plus missionaries everywhere. So you tell me: Can we really undertake the work of the ministry if our giving doesn't even measure up to Old Testament levels of generosity?

Youth Ministry Program Update

We have a new Youth Logo that reflects the three pillars of our youth program. Thank you to Susan Harman for her work on this.



The youth will no longer meet on Wednesday evenings, but will meet on Sundays (or some other time during the weekend). Too many students could not attend meetings on Wednesdays because of sports and other extra-curricular activities. This also allows us to meet with other area youth groups who meet on Sundays. We plan on regularly having Bible studies as well as a service activity and a fellowship activity each month.

On Oct. 22 we invited the youth groups from St. Stephens, St. Johns, St. Peters and Christ Lutheran to join us for the "Three D" gathering. We had <u>Devotions</u>, <u>Dinner and an awesome Dodgeball game</u>. We had 10 Concordia youth attend and 32 youth overall. We plan on doing this again at St. Stephens Lutheran in January. We also attended the SED Youth Gathering in Virginia on November 3-5 with 149 other youth and on November 12 we helped some of our older Concordia members with some yard work.

Bill Unverfehrt has also started a "Hang-Out Time" on Tuesdays from 3-5 pm for the CCDS Middle School Students. These students come to the Youth Center to hear about upcoming youth events, play games and spend time with their friends. We averaged 23 youth the first three weeks. Our goal is to eventually get them involved as a group in church youth activities.

In December our youth will have the opportunity to be a part of the Congregational Extravaganza and Christmas Caroling on December 3. They can participate in either one or both, if they have time.

On December 9 we are traveling to Mountainside Lutheran to help give the kids at Crossnore School a Christmas party. These are students who have been removed from their families by the court system and we want them to understand the love of Jesus extends to them also.

Our Senior Youth will be joining St. John's Lutheran youth for a lock-in on Friday, December 15. The schedule includes seeing Christmas lights, devotions, gift exchange, eating, games, movies, and breakfast the next morning. Sleep is not on the agenda.

We will have a Christmas gift wrapping party on Sunday, December 17 at 12:00. We will be wrapping gifts for the family that we are supporting for Christmas. **Congregational members can help supplement the \$10 that the youth are contributing toward these gifts.** To better understand the need, the parents usually just ask for food and the basics such as clothes and shoes. Just drop your donation off at the church office or in the offering plate marked for the Youth Christmas Family.




Reflection

Every day God's presence is with you. He is your strength when the world seems to be devouring you. When the responsibilities of work, parenting, and family life begin to over-whelm you, God is right there in the middle of all the chaos. When you rely on His strength and put your trust in Him, He promises to help you. As a result, you will experience a joyful heart that will want to praise and give thanks to the Lord for His goodness to you. This is called gratitude – the quality of being thankful, to show appreciation for, and to return kindness. As parents, it is important to model a grateful heart so that your children will develop an attitude of gratitude. Children today are growing up in a world of overabundance and materialism. They take for granted what they already have, while still desiring more. Teaching your child to be thankful for what he has, and what he receives, is the beginning of learning how to be grateful. A thankful heart leads to a grateful heart. Several studies over the past years have found that gratitude is linked to happiness in children by age 5. They also revealed that grateful children tend to be more optimistic, have greater satisfaction with their family, school, friends, and themselves. Kids who are grateful also tend to be more hopeful about their future as they reflect on things that have happened in their past. So where and how do you begin teaching your children how to be grateful? The where is in their daily life as you teach them about everything God has done for them and for your family. The how begins with having a thankful heart and praising God for His goodness through their words and actions.
