YOU SHALL HAVE NO OTHER gODS

The 1st Commandment seems like a no-brainer. Since there

is only one God, then why do we even need this commandment? "Hear, O Israel, The Lord our God, the Lord is one" (Dt 6:4). The explanation to the 1st Commandment gives us a hint why we need this Commandment. "We should fear, love, and trust in God above all **things**" (emphasis added). The reason the title of this article uses a lower case, "g," is another clue to why we need this Commandment. "Things," all too often take the place of, and become for us gods. A god is anything that we place ahead of the one true God. With this definition, there are innumerable gods available for us to follow.

The late, great, Chicago Bears Running Back, Gale Sayers, in his autobiography, *I Am Third*, wrote, "The Lord is first, my friends are second, and I am third." This thought is echoed in Holy Scripture, "Fear the Lord your God and serve Him only" (Dt. 6:13).

When we fear, love, and trust in things over God, we are laying up for ourselves treasures on earth. The gods of power, prestige, wealth, possessions, will eventually take possession of us and we will forget the Lord

our God. When the people of Israel were about to enter the Promised Land, they were forewarned. They were going to live in cities and houses they did not build. They would draw from wells they did not dig. They would drink and eat from vineyards and olive trees they did not plant. The strong admonition followed, "When you eat and are full, then take care lest you forget the Lord, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery" (Dt. 6:11-12).

The Church of Jesus Christ is composed of those who have been freed from the slavery to sin and given the promised land of heaven. We have been given blessings we do not deserve, blessings we did not work for. Christ Jesus did the work for us. His suffering, death, and resurrection was done all for us and for our salvation. Having been so blessed, let us take heed, lest we forsake the Lord, our God, following the gods of our own making and placing the one true God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, into a subordinate, lesser role. Do we still need the 1st Commandment? Maybe more now than ever before! The Lord our God is the source of all our blessings. Let us ever and always acknowledge Him to be our one, true, eternal, (capital G) God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Amen and Amen!

What Do You Want?

One of the best-known and most-beloved psalms is Psalm 23, the "Shepherd Psalm." There we learn that the Lord is our Shepherd. And since He is our Shepherd, we will not want. We will not suffer want because the Lord, our Shepherd, will lead us to green pastures and beside still waters. In other words, the Lord, our Shepherd, will provide for all that we need in both body and soul.

Yet, we live as though this is not the case. We live as though we *actually* suffer from want, that the Lord, our Shepherd, will not provide for all that we need. And thus, we live as though the Lord is not our Shepherd. And that means that we live as though we are not the Lord's sheep.

When do we live as though the Lord is not our Shepherd? When we put anything else before Him and His provision for us. When we think that going to work is more important than receiving His gifts in church on Sunday (in violation of the First and Third Commandments). When we fail to give generously of the first fruits of what the Lord has provided for us because we don't know what the future will bring (even though He has promised that He will lead us to green pastures and still waters).

We live as though we are not the Lord's sheep when we think that the Lord is only in the business of helping those who will help themselves. We act this way because our minds are set on earthly, temporal things and not on heavenly, eternal things. We act this way because we have stopped hearing the call of our Shepherd, which comes through His Word.

Through the Word of God, the Shepherd calls us to Himself. Through the Word, the Holy Spirit gathers and enlightens us with His gifts. Through the Word, we are kept holy and nourished in the one true faith, the faith that follows our Shepherd wherever He leads us. He promises to lead us to our true home, to the land flowing with milk and honey, to a better country, not of this world, but a heavenly one.

And so, here's the Good News: the Lord is your Shepherd, even and especially for wayward sheep. For Jesus seeks and saves those who are lost. He finds the lost sheep and carries them back to the fold. He is the Shepherd who lays down His life for His sheep. The Lord is your Shepherd. Let us live as His sheep.

Joy in Living – A Ladies Tea Devotion, Part 1

It's early in the morning of a spring March day and it's raining. As I hear the rain pouring down, I step outside my front porch door and am delighted by what I see! The rain is flowing straight down on a patch of tulips that are illuminated by a light. It is so amazingly beautiful and like nothing I have ever seen before that I have to hurry back inside to get my phone, so that I do not miss my opportunity to capture this vision of beauty and peace. I then begin taking picture after picture so I can hold on to this moment of time enjoying God's glorious gift of spring.

When I stepped back inside, I began thinking about how God's creation consumes us with His Presence and how His glory surrounds us in the beauty of spring and the gift of a new and refreshed life. The darkness and dead of winter lies in stillness and retreats behind us as we awaken to a renewing of God's promises. He pours out on us blessing upon blessing revealing His enduring love for His people – to those He has called to be His own. But it's not just the pouring out of the rain that we see, it's also His voice we hear thundering in the sky reminding His people of His Presence and His promises – promises to pour out on us the desires of our heart as we call on His name, trust in His Word, obey His commands, and live in His love.

As I experienced this magical spring moment, I was taken over by joy. It consumed my heart and embraced my body. My spirit was overflowing with God's gift of joy.

But what exactly is this gift, and how does it differ from happiness?

<u>Joy is:</u>

- 1. A state of being, something that stays with you it's always a part of who you are.
- 2. It differs from happiness which comes and goes. Joy is lasting and brings true satisfaction which happiness, even at its best moment, cannot.
- 3. Joy satisfies the heart in a way that happiness, which is temporary, never can. This is because happiness is found in the moment and is measured by our circumstances or situations. Happiness is found in earthly tangibles and can be lost. It lasts for only a moment of time. (Donna)

4. Joy, however, is measured by what we have been given through Jesus. As Christians we have been given something that cannot be taken away. We have joy because of the saving grace of Jesus Christ that lives in us. We can hold onto joy, we can feel joyful, and we can rejoice with praise no matter what our circumstances may be because no matter what is going on in our lives God is always near. Even if we are having a bad day, as we all experience at some time, we can joyfully focus on our Savior and who He is in our life and who He is to the world.

"But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace," Galatians 5:22a

5. Paul tells us in his book of Galatians that joy is a fruit of the Spirit. What is the fruit of the Spirit? The supernatural and spontaneous work of the Holy Spirit in us and characterizes the people of God. If the Holy Spirit is dwelling within a Christian's heart, then joy will be an attribute that should be noticeably evident in his life. It is important to know and to believe that there is no power of positive thinking that can bring lasting joy. No time spent with a therapist or counselor will bring lasting joy. True joy is found in Jesus and His absolute surrender and self-sacrifice to His Father.

"Be full of joy in the Lord always. I will say again, be full of joy . . . Do not worry about anything, but pray and ask God for everything you need, always giving thanks. And God's peace, which is so great we cannot understand it, will keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus." Philippians 4:4,6-7 NCV

Reflection

Philippians 4 can be a bit perplexing to live one's life by. "Be full of joy" is emphasized by Paul when he repeated it twice in one verse. Yet, how can a person be full of joy when there seems to be so many frustrations, heartaches, pain, sickness, stress, and more in the world surrounding us and our families. When isolating the words, "full of joy always," it will seem out of reach in our daily living. However, when Paul says to be **full of joy in the Lord**, he is referring to our ability to have a relationship with our Lord. When we are in close fellowship with Him, He is all we desire. We know and trust that we can come to our Heavenly Father in prayer for all our needs and He will hear us. Once our requests are laid before Him, we need to let them go, to put our worry aside, and find peace in knowing that He will answer our prayers according to His will for our children. This peace is something we cannot begin to understand. It comes from being thankful and keeping our hearts and minds focused on Jesus. The one thing that prevents us from receiving God's peace is when we fail to take all of our worries and concerns to God in prayer. As we try to deal with the issues of raising our children on our own, we needlessly wallow in a pool of fear and anxiousness. Instead, go to God in prayer over your child and leave your requests with Him. God does not promise to change the circumstances to our liking, but He does promise us peace in the iourney.


