

THREE DOWN, SEVEN TO GO

In Matthew 22, Jesus was asked what the greatest commandment was. He responded, "'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the greatest and first commandment. And the second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself." The commandments are summed up in this, love for God, love for neighbor. Commandments 1-3, love for God. Commandments 3-10, love for neighbor. The love of God and the love from God points us to the Savior, Jesus, who loved us and gave His life for us. Without that saving love of Christ, commandments 3-10 fall in utter failure.


Let us consider the 1st Commandment of the 2nd Table of the Law, Commandment 4 and its meaning. "Honor Your Father and Your Mother." (What does this mean?) "We should fear and love God so that we do not despise or anger our parents and other authorities, but honor them, serve and obey them, love and cherish them."

This sounds like a pretty good deal for parents. You tell your child to jump, and they better jump. "Junior, get me a soda, wash my car, make me some nachos! You have to obey me, God said so!" Is this what we think the 4th Commandment means? Do we think that God has given us little servants who are duty bound to do our bidding while we sit and watch television?

Just the opposite is true. Parents and other authorities, (legal guardians, pastors, teachers, etc.) are God's representatives used by Him to nurture, train, protect, and support the most naïve and vulnerable among us. Children are to honor their father and mother and various authorities because they are dependent on them for things they could never provide for themselves.

In the parent/child relationship, providing the usual things takes center stage; food, clothing, shelter, protection. Among all those necessities of life, one aspect must come first. Train up a child to know the love of God in Christ Jesus, for He is the Way, Truth, and Life, and our children will have a foundation to carry them through all the ups and downs in life and will set them on the path of loving God and loving and serving their neighbor. So, children, honor your father and your mother, especially as they are seeking, loving and trusting in God first.

Stewardship in the First Commandment

The greatest gift that Martin Luther gave to us was his Small Catechism. The word "enchiridion" is part of the original title of this work. This is the Greek word for "handbook." The Small Catechism is a handbook of the Bible. All the basic knowledge that a Christian needs to understand the faith and live a godly life has been taken from the Bible and distilled into this beautiful little book of Christian piety.

Luther starts with the Ten Commandments.

The First Commandment:

You shall have no other gods.

What does this mean? We should fear, love, and trust in God above all things. (SC I)

We have a God above us. He is the Lord God and we are not. He is Almighty and in control. He is righteous and good. And therefore, we should fear Him.

This God is also our heavenly Father. He wants us to be saved. He does not want us to suffer His just wrath. He has provided salvation for us in His Son, Jesus Christ. And therefore, we should love Him.

Our heavenly Father will never leave us nor forsake us. He has promised as much — and the Bible shows us that He always keeps His promises. So, we should trust Him.

In the Large Catechism, Luther explains how money and possessions form one of the greatest temptations against the First Commandment:

This I must unfold somewhat more plainly, that it may be understood and perceived by ordinary examples of the contrary. Many a one thinks that he has God and everything in abundance when he has money and possessions; he trusts in them and boasts of them with such firmness and assurance as to care for no one. Lo, such a man also has a god, Mammon by name, i.e., money and possessions, on which he sets all his heart, and which is also the most common idol on earth. He who has money and possessions feels secure, and is joyful and undismayed as though he were sitting in the midst of Paradise. On the other hand, he who has none doubts and is despondent, as though he knew of no God. For very few are to be found who are of good cheer, and who neither mourn nor complain if they have not Mammon. This [care and desire for money] sticks and clings to our nature, even to the grave. (LC I 5–9)

These words of Dr. Luther should call us to repentance; sometimes, we live and act like we don't have a Father in heaven. We seek our comfort and peace outside of His gracious promises. But we do have a Father in heaven. He does love us. All His promises are true. And the Lord will surely provide. If that is our belief, then our outward lives will reflect our belief in our acts of generosity and mercy. We will see money and possessions not as gods but rather as tools for doing God's work.



Likewise, if you are interested in participating with the Praise Group which also meets on Wednesday evenings, speak with Kyle about the opportunities with this group.









Spiritual Building Blocks for Parents Written by Kathy Unverfehrt



Scripture Verse

"If anyone speaks, he should do it as one speaking the very words of God. If anyone serves, he should do it with the strength God provides, so that in all things God may be praised through Jesus Christ. To Him be the glory and the power for ever and ever. Amen."

1 Peter 4:11

Reflection

Godly parenting requires not only the desire, but the means, in how to parent children in a way that reflects God's will. The desire to raise children according to God's will stems from the heart. It is a deep conviction from within that motivates you to seek God as your personal parenting counselor, to listen to His advice, and the will power to follow through on what He is communicating to you. When you speak God's word to your child, you must do so in a way that shows as if God himself was speaking to directly to him. For example, if your children are arguing or being mean to each other, convey God's command to love one another. Then, go one step further and show them God's Word in the Bible (John 13:34 is an excellent reference). One example of love in action is to serve others. Teach your children servanthood by, not only modeling it, but involving them in the act of service (when age appropriate). Verbally express to them that their acts of love and helping others is a way in which we praise God, but also an avenue for people to see Jesus living in them. When people see this, it provides an opportunity for them, too, to praise Christ Jesus. The means in godly parenting is extremely uncomplicated, very directive, and allows for no exceptions or excuses. The means is God's Holy Word, the Bible, and it is filled with God's wisdom, as well as examples of how parents in both the Old and New Testaments carried out God's commands. Parenting according to God's Word is a way that engages your children to live a life that reflects the words and life of Jesus. To parent in this way, you must seek, depend on, and live through Christ Jesus. To Him be the glory forever and ever!
