

SPRING FORWARD

Spring forward, fall back. Twice a year we have to adjust our clocks. In November we set them back 1 hour and in March we spring ahead 1 hour. The benefits of this yearly practice are debatable. However, this year we, the members of Concordia Lutheran Church will have the blessing of seeing our Contemporary service springing sideways. After some important discussions, much prayer and an open forum, the decision has been made to move the Contemporary Service from the School Gymnasium to the Sanctuary. This next step in the worship life of our church will take place on March 31st, Easter Sunday. I can think of no better time to make this move. Easter Sunrise at 8:00 am will be in the sanctuary followed by breakfast in the Family Life Center. Easter Egg Hunt is at 10:00am followed by worship in the sanctuary. Both services worshiping in the same space will bring many blessings. For there is nothing that unites us more as followers of Jesus Christ than the day of His resurrection. The church of Jesus Christ is united in His death and resurrection (Romans 6).


With renewed focus on unity, we hope to see an increase in Bible Study and Sunday school attendance. There will be greater opportunity for fellowship between services as we

actually get to know our brothers and sisters in Christ who attend a different service. We do ask for everyone's prayers and patience during this time of transition.

From the practical side there will be no need for chairs to be set up every Saturday night in the gym and taken down after each service. No one will have to cross the street (sometimes in the rain) to come for Bible study. We can also start using more effectively the updated technology recently installed in the sanctuary to better enhance our worship services. The bottom line and most important aspect of this decision is that it will promote increased unity within the body of Christ. "There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to one hope that belongs to your call, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all who is over all and through all and in all" (Ephesians 4:5-6). One body of Christ, soon to be worshiping under one roof. Praise the LORD! "Oh come, let us worship and bow down; let us kneel before the LORD our Maker! For he is our God, and we are the people of his pasture, and the sheep of his hands (Psalm 95:6-7). May the blessings of almighty God direct us to worship and praise Him, from who all blessings flow.

Cherish What God Has Given

In the Small Catechism, Luther follows a pattern when explaining the Ten Commandments. With each commandment, there is something prohibited, and something commanded. There is something wrong which must be avoided, and there is something right which must be done.

The one time this pattern is not followed is with the Sixth Commandment.

"You shall not commit adultery. What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we lead a sexually pure and decent life in what we say and do, and husband and wife love and honor each other" (SC I).


Here, the catechism focuses solely on the positive: we should live in a chaste and decent manner in both word and deed, and husbands and wives should cherish and honor one another.

Keeping this commandment, and all of the commandments, is a lot easier if you see your chastity and your spouse as a gift from God that is to be protected and cherished. In the same way, you will find keeping the Fourth Commandment easier if you see your parents and other authorities as a gift from God, given to you for your blessing.

This is the key stewardship insight that runs through all of the Christian life: Everything that we have has been given to us by God. We deserve none of it. All of it comes to us by God's fatherly kindness and open-handed generosity. If I know that everything I have — every possession, every relationship, every ability — is a gift from God, then my perspective changes. All of these things are both gifts to be cherished, and things that I should direct towards God's purposes. My possessions should be shared generously according to how God has called me in my family, church and community. My spouse should be cherished, loved and encouraged in faith. My children are on loan from my own Heavenly Father, and I have but a brief time to show them the path of righteousness. My neighbor is a gift from God so that I can imitate His kindness toward me.

No matter the gift, everything has been given to me by God so that I may participate in His own goodness and openhanded generosity.

Did you know the story of our present buildings?

Recently in these pages we've considered Concordia's inception and our growth through the years immediately following World War II. If you are "of a certain age," you will recall that the mid-20th century was a period of unprecedented growth and prosperity. Our most recent "Did you know" story ended with the school rebounding from some sad years and the church bursting at the seams with all those "baby boomers" and their parents, as well as the older stalwarts.

Anything as major as a building project will attract much attention, and such was the case with Concordia congregation when it became apparent that a new building was needed, necessitated by both the age of the turn-of-the-century building and the growing number of worshippers. So – how to build? Traditional or modern? Opinions were strong on either side; records in our archives reveal that dialogue was characteristically robust. But, again characteristically, Concordia eventually went with "hearts together" into the new project.

Citing our centennial history, *Hope is Remembering with Praise*, we learn that an architectural firm was engaged to build "a contemporary church with Gothic lines in the shape of a cross." AG Odell Jr. accepted the challenge (stout fellow). In April 1956 the congregation reviewed the plans and voted: 194 in favor, 16 against. Concordia once again was ready to step out boldly into uncharted territory. The following January the congregation of more than 500 celebrated ground breaking.

Conover lore records that people came from near and far to observe the Conover project. Was it celestially beautiful? Was it uglier than homemade sin? Whichever side public opinion fell, it was and to this day continues to be a point of fascination to Conover residents and visitors.

An interesting feature of the current building, which housed worship, Sunday school, and school functions, is that it incorporated much of the precious former building. In the narthex the cross from the old church stands in a place of honor; the present day chapel is almost in entirety the old church relocated. Concordia's rich heritage, including memorial stained glass windows, altar, and furnishings, is preserved, used, and treasured.

Just recently the sanctuary received an update. The organ pipes were moved to the placement of the original plan; the dossal cloth was replaced (custom-made by the same weaver); the flooring was upgraded to tile throughout; and the windows were cleaned and repaired. Tree damage from a devastating storm nearly wrecked the chapel, but quick intervention by loyal parishioners saved it, after which it was also thoroughly cleaned and refurbished. We continue to improve acoustics, and screens have been tastefully installed to enhance the worship experience.

Concordia's commitment to worship and education continues to grow in beauty and loving attention well into her third century.

Don't make rash promises. Remember that I feel badly let down when promises are broken.


Don't forget that I cannot explain myself as well as I should like. That is why I am not always accurate.
