 $\ensuremath{\mathbb{P}}$  Let us confess our unworthiness and ask His grace and mercy.

Through Ezekiel, God said that He would "search for My sheep and will seek them out."

- C We confess that we have wandered away as erring sheep, preferring the pleasures of this world rather than the rich pastures You have provided. Forgive us, O Lord.
- P Paul wrote that "God has put all things in subjection under Christ's feet."
- C We confess that we have not always been loyal subjects of our Lord, but have made decisions based on our own thoughts and desires. Forgive us, O Lord.
- P Jesus foretold that He will judge people about how they treated others—the hungry, strangers, and prisoners.
- C We confess that we have not always sought to share Your love and meet the needs of the people around us. We cannot

## change without Your grace, mercy, and strength. Forgive us, O Lord.

P Rejoice! The One who comes to judge is the same Jesus who is the one who gave His body and shed His blood for you on the cross. He is the first to rise from death, and by His grace we shall follow Him to His eternal kingdom. As a called and ordained servant of Christ and by His authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the T Son and of the Holy Spirit.
