


P Almighty Father,

OLD TESTAMENT READING





NICENE CREED



LIGHTING OF THE CANDLES

The Pastor, taking a large candle, lights it from a candle on the Advent Wreath, symbolizing Christ, the Light of the World. Then the Pastor says:

P Arise, shine; for your Light has come, and the glory of the Lord has risen upon you . . . And nations shall come to your Light. Jesus said, "I am the Light of the World; He who follows Me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." "You are the light of the world . . . Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in Heaven."

The Pastor gives light to the ushers, they in turn give light to the first worshipper in each pew, who passes it on.
