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

THIS CHANGES EVERYTHING

If something, anything is to be changed, it must be modified in some recognizable way. To modify means a slight change or minor alteration. I wanted to make sure that I knew the proper definition of the word so, I looked up the meaning. The dictionary said the word modify is a "transitive verb." So, of course, I needed to look up what transitive meant. Here is the dictionary definition of transitive.

Being or relating to a relation with the property that if the relation holds between a first element and a second and between the second element and a third, it holds between the first and third elements.

There you have it. Thanks to the dictionary for making it so clear that I'm a dunce. Sometimes definitions do not provide the help one desires. Sometimes definitions, even when they are understood, still don't help. I will, therefore, modify my approach and head in another direction.

There are things we would change if we could; things about ourselves, our families, our world. And not just a slight change or minor alteration but a wholesale, all out transformation. We desire to be more faithful followers of Jesus. We have a desire for our children to come back to the faith. We have a desire for our world to stop its continual spiraling downward. The challenge comes when the desire comes face to face with the magnitude of such endeavors. Change, real change is hard, and it takes a persistence and a tenacity that never gives up. Most people are not willing to go that far, either with themselves or with others. Our God alone is

that persistent. Our God desires all people to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth, (1Timothy 2:4). To secure that desire of His, Jesus comes not to slightly change things or to provide a minor alteration but to totally transform those who come to Him in faith. In our baptism into His death and resurrection (see Romans 6) we are brought out of darkness into His light. We are brought from death to life. All who are in Christ are new creations, (2Cor5). New creations with a new perspective, new direction, and new desires.

Our perspective, direction, and desires are guided by the Holy Spirit to please the Lord in thoughts, words and deeds. In so doing we glorify God, honor Christ Jesus, and we serve our loved ones and even the world with the much needed presence of Jesus. Let us live and love as those who have been eternally changed.

To God alone be the glory through Jesus Christ our Savior.

"The Singing Church"

Lutherans have historically been called "the singing church." There is no doubt that music has been a major component in the theology and practice of the Lutheran church. Luther once remarked about music, "We can mention only one point, namely, that next to the Word of God, music deserves the highest praise." Music has a power and purpose that cannot be understated in our worship and the life of the congregation.

But music does more than touch the emotions. Music is a vehicle that carries both the musician and the hearer deeper into connection with the truth of the Scriptures. This is true of the most complex Bach chorale and even the simplest of songs like "Jesus Loves Me, This I Know." Each musical selection within the church shapes the thoughts, minds and faith of the people who experience them.

This is also true of stewardship hymns. We are currently considering the verses of "Forgive Us, Lord, for Shallow Thankfulness" (LSB 788) as it shapes our understanding and practice of stewardship. This month we take a deeper dive into verse two:

Teach us to thank you, Lord, for love and grace For life and vision, for a purpose clear, For Christ Your Son, and for each human face that shows Your message ever new and near.

The stanza begins by touching on the truth of the Law. Thankfulness is not a natural posture for fallen humanity. For sinners curved in upon themselves, thankfulness for love and grace is something that must be taught. We are those who hoard and clutch. Our confession of our shallow thankfulness highlights the need for us to learn thankfulness to God.

Thankfulness also points to what we are stewards of: love and grace! All the things we have traditionally called stewardship aren't actual stewardship. Rather, what matters is how we steward the one, true and only treasure: the love and grace of God revealed to us in the Gospel of Jesus Christ. So, all stewardship is stewardship of the Gospel! How can we gaze at the cross and empty tomb and not be thankful?

The LCMS defines stewardship as "the free and joyous activity of God's family — the church — in managing life's resources for His purposes." God's love and mercy give us a clear purpose as we live out our Baptism and practice this joyous stewardship. All we are, all we have entrusted to us, and all we are called to do is to connect others with the love and mercy of God revealed in Jesus!

The faithful steward sings with lips and life of this love and mercy that is ever new and near. In the Scriptures. In the Lord's House. At the Lord's Table. This is where our stewardship song starts and ends. Our family, our co-workers and classmates, and our world need to hear this song!

SUNDAY MORNING FELLOWSHIP!

Fellowship is not possible without volunteers to make the coffee, set out the stocked items, and provide fresh fruit or a sweet or savory treat. You can volunteer by using the QR code or by calling the church office. It is very easy to manage, it just takes a little of your time on Sunday mornings to get things organized. Please consider being a part of this fellowship ministry. See the instructions on the next page.

Sunday Fellowship Notes

Everything needs to be set up by 9:50 and start the clean-up at 10:10 to ensure everyone gets to their Sunday school class.

How to Make Coffee:

Coffee filter packs are kept in the far left hand cabinet. Red packs are regular coffee, orange packs are decaffeinated coffee.

- Turn on the machine.
- Fill a pot with water.
- Place a filter pack of coffee in the coffee filter basket and push it into the machine.
- Place an empty pot under the brewer. (Use the orange handled pot for decaf.)
- Pour water into the machine. (It will start brewing immediately, so make sure there is an empty pot underneath while you're pouring in the water and the coffee packet is in the basket.)
- Repeat as needed to make 2 pots of regular and 1 pot of decaf (orange handled pot).

Paper Products:

Set out plates/napkins/utensils - whatever is needed. We typically do not set out plates unless there are food items that require plates or eating utensils. These items are located in the cabinets under the counter.

Grab and Go Items:

Stock the grab and go snack bins with items stored underneath the counter on the right-hand side. These items do not need to be put away.

Cheese and Crackers:

Cheese is provided in the small fridge. Set out some cheese and crackers (stored under the counter) on a platter that is also located under the counter.

Additional Snacks:

The fruit and snack you bring will be set out with the above. Feel free to turn in your receipts to the church office if you would like to be reimbursed.

Drinks:

In addition to the coffee, there is a water dispenser in the narthex. Juice is kept in the refrigerator in the fellowship room.

Clean Up:

You can use the sink in the attached room if needed to help with clean up. There are towels and dishcloths in the drawer on the far left. These can be taken home to be laundered and returned. Please empty the coffee pots into pots in the kitchen and/or wash and put in the kitchen to dry. All bagged food items supplied by the church can be left out.



Reflection

One of the toughest tasks parents have today is teaching their children about friendships. The experiences and challenges we have faced in the social world have given us knowledge and wisdom that our younger children have no concept of, and that our older children need to be taught. We have faced disappointments, heartaches, and emotional anxieties that our children have yet to experience. We cannot assume that children will navigate through building relationships all on their own. Nor should we even desire this for them by thinking that they will learn from their mistakes. Learning from one's mistakes is certainly a valuable tool, however, in regards to developing healthy relationships it can have a longer lasting negative effect in their lives. Therefore, it is imperative that we teach our children how to develop, not just friendships, but godly friendships. As parents, we need to spend time with our children in intentional and instructional discussions about friendship. The importance of this directly relates to the impact your teaching will have on your child as he maneuvers his way into the social world – a world that often extends beyond the security of his own family. One lesson to teach your child is how to be a good and godly friend – the kind of friend that Jesus is to all people. The Apostle Paul gives us insight to this type of friend in his words to the Colossians. He shares with us parenting advice in leading our children to reflect Jesus to others through the friendships they will develop. Through our modeling and instruction, we are to teach our children to show mercy to others, be kind, humble, gentle, and patient. There is no compromising Paul's words and the example we set for our children through our own friendships. What they see in us is what they will learn and

Boost Your Child's Self-Esteem

Praising accomplishments, however small, will make your child feel proud; letting kids do things independently will make them feel capable and strong. By contrast, belittling comments or comparing a child unfavorably with another will make him feel worthless.

Catch Your Child Being Good

Make it a point of finding something to praise your child about every day. Your hugs, love, and compliments can work wonders.

3. Set Limits and Be Consistent with Your Discipline

The goal of discipline is to help kids choose acceptable behaviors and learn self-control. Establishing house rules helps your child to understand your expectations. Consistency in your discipline helps kids learn that you mean what you say.

4. Make Time for Your Kids

Many parents find it rewarding to schedule together time with their kids. Create a "special night" each week to be together and let your kids help decide how to spend the time. Look for other ways to connect like putting a note or something special in your child's lunchbox.

Be a Good Role Model

Model the traits you wish to see in your kids: respect, friendliness, honesty, kindness, tolerance. Exhibit unselfish behavior. Do things for other people without expecting something in return. Express thanks and offer compliments.

The Stewart's Seminary Journey

Seminary here we come!

First, let us begin by saying thank you! Thank you for your prayers, your words of encouragement, your financial support and all the outpouring of love that we have felt as we embarked on this new adventure. God is leading us on this amazing adventure as I begin my studies at Concordia Seminary in St. Louis, MO to be trained to become an LCMS pastor. This summer has been filled with many emotions and firsts. Late this winter Jessica and I began entertaining the idea of returning to ministry. In all honesty, I was content being a church participant and did not have many thoughts of getting back in the professional ministry ranks, lol, as the saying goes, "if you want to hear God laugh, tell Him your plans." In our discussions and discernment it became clear to us quickly that God had a plan for us to be open to a return to vocational ministry. I immediately assumed that meant being open to a Director of Christian Education call and so I began the process of starting conversations with the District. Those conversations shifted as God began to work through those interactions to plant and water the seed for us to consider the route of pastoral ministry. As a surprise to me, and yet seemingly not a surprise to many friends, family and ministry colleagues, God was preparing us for this journey for a long time. I, myself, was just slow to come to the realization, but all in God's timing. Long story short after, going through all the steps we decided to begin the Seminary this summer as I needed to complete Biblical Greek in preparation for fall classes.

We spent a large chunk of May and beginning of June finalizing details and packing up. One of the hardest parts to this journey was leaving family, friends and all we had grown accustomed to over the last several years. How would this



impact the girls? Saying goodbyes was definitely the hardest. But by prayer and trust in God and with encouragement even from those who were some of the most difficult goodbyes we set out for Missouri in June. As our oldest Aileen said when we first brought up the idea of moving, "It will be an adventure, dad". Isn't it humbling when your own children get it better than we do. Faith like a child is so simple and yet we try to overly complicate it.

My summer Greek courses began almost immediately upon arrival and so I was inundated with the "Greek fog" as we joked that kept me from being able to help much with our settling in. Thanks to Jessica's wonderful attention to detail and meticulous planning she was able to orchestrate and get us settled in before she and the girls began school. We found time to meet a few new people while also trying to begin to find some new norms in our new region of the world. The girls are champs and have settled in quite nicely, yes, with the expected and completely understandable swings of emotion that come with being apart from family and friends for the first times in their lives but overall they have embraced this new adventure God is leading us on with great anticipation.

They began their new school, Christ Community Lutheran School on August 14 and had a great half week of school to begin the year. Our school's theme this year is "Joyful in Jesus' Love" and how fitting it is in all seasons and all circumstances for us to remember to be joyful in the Lord. Jessica is working at the elementary school as the Full-Time Substitute Teacher.
